<b>Description:</b>	<p>In task 1.7.1 keyword searches were case-insensitive. In task 1.8.0 they became case-sensitive. Both are equally useful depending on the circumstances. The user should have a choice in which method is used.</p> <p>Example tasks where one might want to search for "bill":</p> <p>Pay monthly bills Pay Bill back the money I owe him</p> <p>I may want to get a listing of tasks that aren't related to a person named Bill. I may want a listing of tasks that are related to a person named Bill. I may want a listing with both of these tasks because I simply don't recall how they were entered at the time.</p>
